## Afghanistan

There is an appalling lack of medical literature in Afghanistan. Part of this is from coups and wars over the last 30 years. Another major reason is the Taliban tenet of forbidding any illustration of the human body as being vulgar. They confiscated and burned any text with any anatomic depiction. They even monitored lectures in the medical schools to make sure no drawings were made. The country is trying to close the educational gap by building up its medical libraries. OML is assisting with that goal. **All recipients need medical and technical dictionaries, as well as anatomy and pharmacology texts.** Unless noted, all of the point of contacts (POC) in Afghanistan can use *textbooks* published within the last five years and have current information. At this time, no paper journals are being accepted.

In italic font, there is a brief description of the POC's role and special requests, including specific book titles. The date in parenthesis indicates the last day to mail materials to that POC, as s/he will be rotating out of that assignment 45 days later. The list indicates any special requests.
